#### Re: November 2024 Headmistress's Letter

I hope you all had a restful half term break and are looking forward to the next few weeks as we roller-coaster towards our Christmas activities and performances.

As you all know we had our routine inspection before the break by the Independent Schools' Inspectorate and I am very much looking forward to sharing the final report with you when we are allowed to publish it. It was a very successful three days of intense scrutiny of our whole school, including the provision of education and systems and processes to safeguard all pupils on site, with feedback we are incredibly proud of.

## **School Uniform and PE Kit**

As we return to school, I would like to remind families that children should come to school in their full winter school uniform, unless they are timetabled for a PE/Games lesson.

We take great care to maintain high standards of uniform and presentation at school. This includes all children wearing the regulation school coat which must be purchased from Forest Casuals in Loughton. In cold weather, the school woollen hat, gloves and scarf, which are also available from the uniform suppliers, should be the only items worn. Please do not allow children to wear hats, gloves and scarves that are not from our uniform suppliers. Blazers should be worn every day. Boots are not suitable to wear for a day in school. Please make sure that all pupils have sturdy black school shoes through the winter months.

If it snows, pupils may wear boots to and from school but will need to wear their normal school shoes in the buildings during the day. If we do have snow before the Christmas break we will aim to let you know by 7am if we need to have a delayed start to the school day to safely clear the footpaths on site. Announcements will be made via Groupcall.

As usual, all items of uniform must be clearly named, preferably in the neck area so that staff can quickly identify the owner. We make every effort to reunite children with named items of clothing, however anything that is unnamed will be placed in the lost property box situated in the covered waiting area for parents, in front of the studio.

## **Individual Photographs**

On Thursday 7 November, individual photographs will be taken of the children. It is particularly important that all the children look smart and are in the correct winter school uniform for these photographs. All long hair should be tied back with the regulation coloured hair bands.

## **Prospective Parents**

We welcomed a large number of prospective families to our Open Morning in October, many of whom are now returning for personal tours of the school. Our Year 6 Prefects acted as tour guides for our prospective parents and it was noted by many visitors how well they conducted themselves whilst touring. Our Head Girl and Boy, Margot and Archie delivered fantastic speeches to a hall full of visitors.

## **September Entry into Early Years**

Our 3+ and 4+ pre-offer taster/assessment programme takes place this half term for children who wish to join the school for entry into Lower and Upper Kindergarten and Reception September 2025. If you have not registered siblings please do this as soon as possible to secure a place for our taster sessions.

#### **OPA**

Thank you to Mrs Chapman and her team who helped supervise all the children at the creche on the second evening of Parent Consultation meetings just before half term. I know a substantial number of children thoroughly enjoyed completing some arts and craft activities.

The OPA are now very busy planning Christmas events for children to enjoy and I believe most of our children will be visiting a very special person in his Grotto! Thank you to those parents who have already volunteered to be the Class Reps for 2024 -25; your hard work is much appreciated!

## **Providing Information to Parents**

As a school, we are always looking for ways to share with you the educational methods our teachers use in the classroom to teach your children.

During this Autumn Term, we have already organised several meetings for different groups of parents: Upper Kindergarten 'Welcome and Ready to read', Reception 'Welcome and RWI' meeting, Year 1 Maths and English Information meeting, Year 3 Maths and English Information meeting and the Year 5 11+ meeting. I hope that parents found the meetings helpful and beneficial to further support their child's learning at home.

## **Parents' Evenings and Drop-in Sessions**

Thank you for attending the meeting with your child's class teacher just before the half term holiday and I hope you found them informative.

During this half-term, we have timetabled a second series of 'Drop-in' sessions for all the classes in KS1 and KS2. These will take place first thing in the morning, 8.25-8.50am. Parents of children in UK and Reception will also receive invitations to attend an opportunity to view their child's work, in the afternoon. UK parents will have an allocated day and time, whereas Reception parents are free to choose which session they attend this half term, either the morning or afternoon session but not both please. We have combined some classes this half term due to the number of school events taking place. If you have a sibling clash, my apologies, please either split the time or ask one of the teachers to accommodate you on another day.

Please refer to the 'Dates List' at the end of this Head's letter to check the date of the 'Drop-in' session for your child during this half term. We try hard to keep to the published dates however, there are rare occasions when for reasons beyond our control, that dates may change. We aim to give parents as much notice as possible.

#### **Awards**

As you are aware, we present several different awards to the children throughout each term.

Merit certificates are presented to two children in each of the KS1 and KS2 classes on a fortnightly basis. A merit certificate can be awarded for a variety of reasons such as using ambitious words in creative writing, excellent problem-solving skills, imaginative art work or independent research work.

Good Behaviour and Friendship awards are also presented on a fortnightly basis.

A 'Good Behaviour' award is presented to a child who consistently displays positive behaviour and acts as a role model to their peers, or to a child who we can see is making extra effort to rectify any disruptive or unsocial behaviour in the classroom or the playground.

The 'Friendship' award is presented to a child who is a caring and understanding member of the class, willing to share, listen and help others. The children often discuss what it means to be a 'good friend' and the School's Code of Behaviour during their class assemblies or in a PSHE circle time.

'Wow' certificates are awarded once every half term in a special 'Wow' assembly. These are presented for an outstanding piece of work, independent research or presentation, or for displaying significant perseverance to complete a task. I also award Head teacher's certificates to a class for a number of reasons, such as excellent attitude and participation during a school visit or an outstanding class assembly. Sometimes individuals receive a Head teacher's certificate for their contribution to the life of the school or for a special achievement or effort in their academic work.

Other awards and badges are awarded throughout the school by individual teachers. All these awards are part of, and enhance, the school's aim to create a positive learning environment for the children, and to continually praise and celebrate their achievement and progress. By having a wide range of awards, we aim to ensure that a substantial number of children receive additional recognition for their effort and work during each half term.

Please be reassured that a log is kept for each award to monitor that there is a fair distribution of awards within each class during an academic year.

#### **Siblings**

As you are aware, we have a system whereby our staff supervise children in 'Siblings' (from 3pm until 3.30pm). Please collect your child from 'Siblings' before you collect your older child. Any child who has not been collected by 3.30pm will automatically be taken to Tea Time club, which does incur a charge.

These arrangements mean that the office staff will be able to provide the correct location of your child to you if there is an occasion when you are late for collection. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

## Changes to afternoon pick up

If, during the school day, you need to change the collection arrangements for your child/children. Please ensure you let the school office know. Teachers do not routinely pick up emails whilst teaching and important collection information may be missed.

# **Harvest and the Whitechapel Mission**

Thank you very much for your generous donations to our Harvest Festival which were given, as usual, to the Whitechapel Mission for the homeless. As you will see from the photographs included in the next Newsletter, the hall was brimming with goods. Tony Miller led a wonderful assembly that highlighted to our pupils exactly where their wonderful donations were going. Later in the year we will collect donations for the Epping Forest Food bank and we are hopeful our Year 5 pupils will have an opportunity to visit the depot in Loughton to see how this important charity stores and distributes the generous donations.

## **Parking reminder**

Thank you to all our parents who are parking responsibly away from the school gates and avoiding the drives of our neighbours. Sadly, we had an increase in inconsiderate parking towards the end of last half term which led to a number of our neighbours complaining to the school office. Please remember not to bring the school name into disrepute by causing distress to local residents.

### **Absence**

Further to my letter in October this is a reminder that no absence for holiday during term time, for any child of statutory school age, will be authorised. It is a legal requirement that pupils of school age are in school unless they are unwell, attending an urgent medical appointment or another reason serious enough to warrant a day's absence.

You must however, still fill in the absence request form, found online, as it is my duty, as the Headteacher, to know where pupils are for each school day. If your child accumulates 15 or more days of absence in any school year, for any reason, this is now reportable to Essex so they can track absences across the district. We are lucky that our holidays are longer than Local Authority schools and I encourage you all not to book flights for school days.

### **Site Security**

As many of you have seen, our new fencing and electronic gates at the Albion Hill entrance to school are very nearly finished. These gates will be closed at 8.45am and will re-open at 2.45pm. All access between these hours will be via the intercom system. Our first collection at the end of the day begins at 3pm so please bear in mind that no parents will have access to the school grounds to wait for their child until these gates are opened automatically at 2.45pm. There is a very small waiting area inside the old school gates for those of you arriving before 2.45pm. Our car park gates open at 2.30pm, slightly earlier, to avoid a backlog of traffic on Warren Hill, however, it is helpful if parents do not walk up to the main school site until 2.45pm.

#### **ISA Autumn Conference**

Miss Dee and I will be out of school on 14 and 15 November as we are attending the Independent School's Association Autumn Study Conference. The conference provides a valuable opportunity to hear and learn about the latest educational developments in the UK and helps us to continue to provide an excellent educational experience for our pupils here at Oaklands. If you are a Reception Owl parent you will see below you are either group A or group B for the Christmas concert. Siblings will not be invited to the Christmas performances but where possible they will be invited to dress rehearsals.

For KS 2 parents, there is one performance for which you can book two tickets, we are aware this date now clashes with Forest 11+ scholarship interviews but sadly we booked the church before these dates were released.

Please rest assured that rehearsals do not disrupt the learning of our core subjects, staff cleverly weave rehearsals into PE, RE, PSHE and Drama lessons.
